# THE LAKE CHURCH.

This church is one of Bulloch's land marks, having been constituted on April 5, 1839, with the following members: Thomas Green, John Dixon, Hezekiah Bowen, Ceny Dixon, Nancy Green, Mary Mercer, Sarah Duberlough and Martha Collins; and is one of the cldest in the county.

Its place of worship is situated on a bluff overlooking "The Lake," a beautiful, shady spot, on Fifteen Mile Creek, in one of the choics sections of Bulloch county. The church is a Primitive Baptist organization and

As the county was developed the church grew, until among the Everetts, Trapuells, Bowens, Parishes, Dixons, Mercers, Dekles and a host of good substantial people in that part of Bulloch, it required a large house to accommodate the calawds who came to the historic "Lake Church" from time to time, and so those people were not stingy but opened their pocket books and erected the largest meeting

house in the county. Those early settlers, as all pioneers who have opened up new territory, needed a rallying point, and what so good as a house dedicated to the worship of God! And so they built, and it stands to day while the venerable oaks, laden with moss, keep sentinel around the church and the silent "City of the dead" near by; those first having gone on before but their worthy successors keep the old church in good repair and take great pide in all things pertaining to the welfare of their beloved place.

Elder M. F. Stubbs is pastor of the church, a man who stands well with his people and in fact, with all the peo ple. He has held the position for some years, and with him as under shepherd the church continues to grow. "The Lake" is one of Bulloch's strongest churches.




