Real Americans

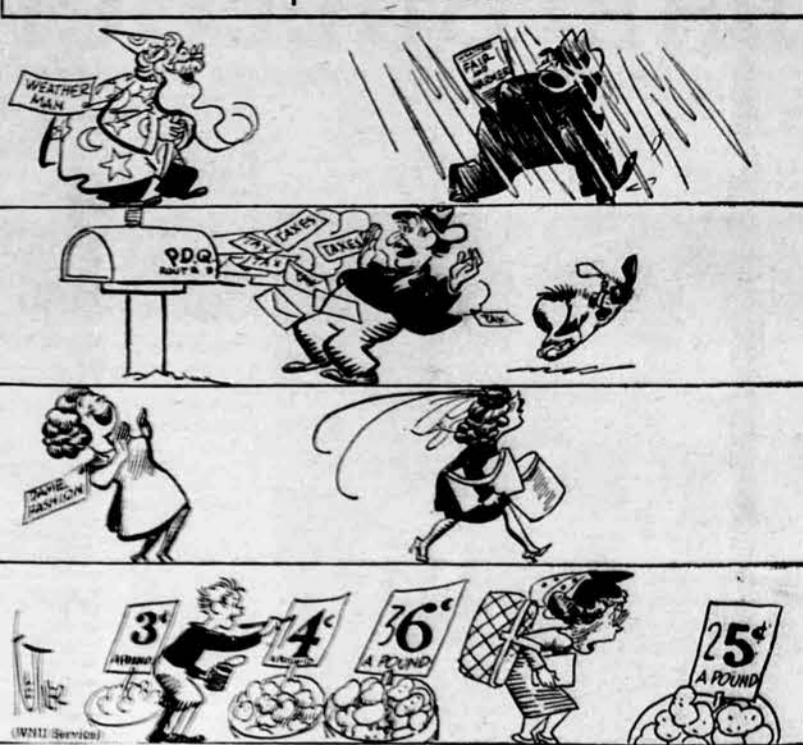

TOBACCO COMMITTEE SEEKS BETTER LEAF



The Southern Tobacco Committee is regarded by growers of bright tobacco as the authority on fertilizer practices for this crop, and each year they look to it for recommendations.

The committee suggests that when less than 50 pounds of K.O. (5% potash in a 1,000 pound to 200 pounds of sulphate of potash equivalent) is applied at planting time, or where potash deficiency is indicated, potash to the extent of 50 to 100 pounds of K.O. (100 to 200 pounds of sulphate of potash equivalent) to the acre be applied as additional side-dressings within 30 days after transplanting.
