With the closing of this season the farmers of the Stilson and Ivanhoe community saw the fulfillment of eight years of co-operative work when the plant returned to them all the money they invested in 1932.

H. C. McElveen, chaiman of the board of directors of the Briar Patch meat curing plant, announced this week that the farmer-owned-operated curing plant and the \$27.50 shares subscribed in 1932 paid \$6 per share for the season and left a surplus of \$160 in the treasury for repairs, expansions and painting.

The Briar Patch plant was built to cure meat for home use and then to sell the finished product when it was possible to get more for hogs after curing the meat. The plant served both of these purposes this season. When the price of hogs declined, more meat was cured and now these co-operating farmers cannot supply the demand for their hams.

During this season 44,000 pounds of joint meat were cured in this plant as compared with 37,000 pounds during 1938-39. The use of electricity for power also reduced the operating expenses by about 40 per cent. Mr. McElveen stated


