HANDY MAP OF ATLANTA ONE-WAY STREETS



Cut this map out and keep it for your trips to Atlanta. Supplied by courtesy of the Belle Isle Garage, it shows the one-way streets, with black arrows giving the direction of each, as well as the main public buildings. A study of this map will show how easy it is to get around Atlanta, and especially how easy it is to get around the downtown area. Note that there are three entrances to this great building in the heart of the City, and that you may drive into any one of the three when you wish to park there.

HARVESTING SERVICE - If seed are to be saved, extension workers suggest that hoppeza service be cut when the seeds are about mature. Provided sufficient time is taken, they can be threshed with the regular threshing machine. Combines are also being used to harvest the seed.

CHURNING WITH POWER - Many hours of monotonous labor can be saved by electrifying the churn, extension specialists point out. Cost of electricity is about 3 cents per 100 pounds of butter churned. It is recommended that the barrel churn operate at about sixty revolutions per minute. This slow speed usually necessitates the use of a speed reducer.

Statesboro Sells \$350,000 Set Aside for Statesboro Airport

The State department of agriculture reported Aug. 12 that \$350,000 pounds of tobacco were auctioned off in the opening week on the Statesboro market for \$189,394.91 to average \$21.37 per hundred pounds. The report added that 19,464,059 pounds of the leaf had been sold on the fifteen markets in the state at a price more than 4 cents a pound above last year's opening. The tobacco sold for \$4,325, 735.50 for an average of 22.75 cents a pound. In the opening week, 12,752,554 pounds were sold for \$2,250,342.38 for an average of 18.43 cents a pound.

Glenn Bland Resigns As City Clerk

Glenn Bland has resigned as clerk of the city of Statesboro. Mr. Bland tendered his resignation which was accepted at the regular meeting of the city council on Tuesday night of this week. Mr. Bland stated that his resignation is effective Oct. 1, 1941. He added that he offered his services until Oct. 15 in order to assist in breaking his record that prices are still holding up at the South Georgia markets.

Countywide Canning Party BULLOCH HOUSEWIVES PUT UP 4,000 BUSHELS



The above photo shows a portion of the four thousand bushels of No. 1 Elberta peaches before they went into 120,000 cans as Bulloch county went on a canning spree Aug. 6. In two days, the ladies and men too, of this county got together and helped the peach grower get rid of a part of the heavy surplus they found themselves with. Orders for the peach were taken by community ladies in each of the canning districts in the county. The surplus Marketing Administration co-operated with the county in bringing the peaches here to be sold at an attractive price. They were distributed from the Women's Market at the Army.

DELMAS RUSHING INSTALLS NEW LUMMUS GIN

New Lummus double moting ginning equipment, with automatic features as modern as those possessed by any ginning plant, has been installed by Delmas Rushing ginney, it was announced this week by Delmas Rushing, owner of the gin.



Lumas automatic double moting gins are known throughout the cotton states for their ability to produce cotton that is in better condition. Mr. Rushing said, "In actual tests where the same cotton has been run side by side, double moting gins have showed samples a full grade better than that produced by the old process gins."
