To the People of Georgia

At an Educational Conference Held in Atlanta, at Which Gentlemen Governor Joseph M. Terrell Presided, the Undersigned Committee Was Appointed to Prepare and Publish the Following Address

TO THE PROPLE OF GEORGIA:

IT is self-evident that in a democracy the intelligence of the people is a necessary condition of good government. For this reason the State undertakes as a means of self-protection the work of public education. Our forefathers accepted and acted on these principles. Immediately following the Declaration of Independence and the institution of a Democratic nment, they provided in the first Constitution of the State, that of 1777, for the establishment of a public school system. In 1785, speaking through their legislature, they declared that the "prosperity and even the existence of the State" can be secured only by "religion and education."

During the 127 years that have elapsed since our first Constitution, the record of Georgia in behalf of public education, considered in the light of conditions that have existed, has been honorable; but the time has now come when a forward movement is imperatively demanded by our interest




