CIRCUS CASH GONE

Thirty Thousand Stolen From Forepaugh & Sells.

SHOW PEOPLE BAFFLED

Maui Was Made While Wagon Was on Flat Car En Route to Tarboro, N. C.—Many Arrests Made But No Clue Found.

While on route on a flat car between Greenville and Tarboro, N. C. early Saturday morning, the ticket wagon of the Forepaugh & Sells Brothers' circus was entered and robbed of \$30,000.

The entrance to the wagon was effected by the use of the regular keys, which had been stolen from the treasurer of the circus. The robbery was not discovered until after the entire circus, which was traveling in three sections over the Atlantic Coast Line, had reached Tarboro.

The ticket wagon was on the second section and arrived at Tarboro at 1 o'clock Saturday morning. The first section reached there a half hour earlier and the third at 2 o'clock in the morning.

It was 5 o'clock before the robbery had been discovered, and from that time on until late Saturday night, when the last report was received at Norfolk, a search of the people connected with the circus was in progress. The police are holding a man and a woman, both performers, on suspicion of having committed the robbery.

Several theories are held by the police and circus people. One of these is that the robbery was committed while the train was in motion and that the money was thrown off the train. Searching parties were sent out along the line between Tarboro and Greenville in an effort to find any trace of the money or of any person who might have left the train with it.

Another theory is that the cash has been hidden in Tarboro by the robbers, the memorable search warrants have been sworn out. Armed with these, the regular police and special detectives searched every place in Tarboro thought likely to conceal the money.

There were a score of arrests made during the day among the circus people. All apprehended were taken into custody on suspicion and while in the town lockup their belongings were searched at the show grounds. Absolutely no trace of the money has been found.

WATSON OUTLINES POLICY.
For Next Four Years He Will Conduct a Vigorous Campaign.

Between 250 and 300 people from McDuffie, Columbia, Warren and neighboring Georgia counties heard Hon. Thomas E. Watson Saturday at Thomson in a speech of nearly two hours' length in which he outlined his policy and the policy of the People's Party for the next four years.

Mr. Watson declared that he proposed to actively campaign in the interest of the People's Party for the next four years, and that he would have abused him would learn that it is a fight to the finish. He declared that they would stand for the income tax, the initiative and referendum, the government ownership of railroad and telegraph lines and for the reforms advocated by the party in the recent national campaign.

Taft Welcomed in New Orleans.
Secretary of War Taft and party reached New Orleans Saturday. They were received by a committee of prominent citizens, members of the governor's staff and a military detail of regulars and members of the state guard.

MISSOURI LOSES STATE BUILDING
Cottly structure at St. Louis World's Fair Reduced to Ashes.

The Missouri state building at the St. Louis fair, was destroyed by fire Saturday evening, resulting from the explosion of a hot water heater in the basement.

The principal loss is in the contents of the building. The building cost \$145,000 and in the building was \$75,000 worth of furnishings, the most valuable of which were portraits of all former Missouri governors and supreme court judges.

TURKEY GIVES BIG ORDER.
Sultan Wants Hundred New Batteries of Artillery.

A dispatch to the Frankfurter-Zeitung (Berlin) from Constantinople says Turkey is ordering a hundred new batteries of artillery from Gornatz, French and English factories at the cost of \$10,000,000. The Krupp company gets the largest contracts.

Every rule has its exceptions, but as a general thing it does no harm for a man who inherits by both of debt for one and financially able to support two.

And now comes an inventor with a telephone attachment that enables you to see the person with whom you are talking, states the Massachusetts Ploverman. An invention, however, that is not likely to add materially to the profits of the companies, except where Central is really needed, is pretty. What is really needed, says some of the telephone users in the West, is an invention that will enable a man to use two different systems and pay for only one of them.

The driving of the launch Mercedes VI, less than forty feet in length, over a thirty-mile course at an average rate of 22.86 knots, or 20.197 miles, an hour, was a marvelous feat. It well illustrates how rapid has been the advance in the design of what is clumsily called the "auto boat," says the New York World. Torpedo boats have lately been made better speed than this, but no launch of the size had until this, even equalled it. The great Deutschland record is only 24.19 knots an hour; and the forty horse-power engine of the Mercedes is in proportion to her bulk, as would be a 200-horse-power engine in the Deutschland. The actual power of the propulsion steamship is 37,500. Such a wonderful little boat reverses all the old notions of water transit as a comparatively inferior affair. The finest clipper ship ever built could sail a little more than half as fast. The best bicycle record is only 67 per cent faster. Dreyfoot's running record for an hour is less than half as fast. Auto on racing is healthier than automobile "scurrying" on land, because it takes no dust. And until car waters become far more crowded it endangers fewer lives among the non-participating public.

GEORGIA.

Brief Summary of Doings Throughout the State.

To Save Georgia Exhibit.

The Georgia exhibit at St. Louis will be brought back to Atlanta at the close of the big exposition, and will be installed on the third floor of the capitol building, as required by the act of the legislature making the appropriation for the museum.

May Establish Colony. Representing a big land syndicate, R. R. and J. O. Lester, of Jacksonville, Fla., were in Macon the past week in quest of some lands on which to place immigrants from western states a colony in south Georgia may be established by the syndicate.

Will Be Kept Out of Service. Company 1 of the South Georgia regiment, located at Statesboro, in DeKalb county, and known as the South Georgia Independents, has been ordered to be kept out of the state service by the command of the governor for insubordination.

Train Robbed on Peach River. Three hundred and fifty boxes of cotton, in the possession of the state grain store at Milledgeville, was robbed by a train of about 200 men, who were accompanied by a number of Mr. Williams, of Statesboro, Ga., who was held at Winesboro a few days ago, and they were discharged.

Twenty Days Not Yet Up. The regular annual election for Democratic officers will not be concluded until twenty days from the 6th of November. Although there are two counties which have not yet sent in their returns, the returns of DeKalb and Columbia, Secretary of State Phil Cook is not allowed under the law to announce the result until within twenty days after the election.

Negroes Under Heavy Bonds. The three negro arrested suspected of burning Tifton Knitting mills and attempted burglary of Smith's and Wagner's drug stores, were given a preliminary hearing and bound in the sum of \$10,000 bond each, which they could not give, and were sent to Milledgeville jail.

University Plans Fall. The plan for consolidating the Columbia Theological Seminary and the Southwestern Presbyterian University into a great million-dollar institution to be located in Atlanta has failed, but new plans for the establishment of a Presbyterian university in the Georgia City are already being formed, and the hope of eventually establishing a great institution of learning there has by no means been abandoned.

To Entertain Electors. Despite the fact that they will not have the much-desired pleasure of voting for a successful democratic candidate, Georgia's presidential electors will be given a day of entertainment on the occasion of their meeting in Atlanta on Monday, January 5, which, as one of them puts it, "may, in some degree, tend to dispel the gloom which will be felt by them because of the overwhelming defeat."

Was for Collection of Debt. Governor Varsham, of Mississippi, has withdrawn a requisition which he had issued in Governor Terrell's favor. Joe Darden was charged in Laurens county on the charge of swindling a man there out of \$57. Darden was located in Mississippi and a requisition sent for him. Governor Varsham at first granted it, but later withdrew his extradition warrant on the ground that Darden was wanted in Georgia simply for the collection of a debt.

Mob Attacks Police Chief. At Irwiningville a few days ago a mob attacked Chief of Police Smith, of Fitzgerald. The attack was the outcome of an arrest made some three weeks ago of Mr. Clements, cousin of Judge Clements, of Irwin county. A defective indictment against the chief was thrown out of court. Mr. Clements and his friends, it is charged, attacked the chief. Hoodlums were prevented by the narrow escape of the chief's bodyguard putting a dash to the horse and beating a retreat.

Baggs Again Exonerated. After bearing evidence for an entire day the grand jury at Bainbridge failed to return a true bill against Mercer Baggs, charged with the killing of John Hunter in a duel between the two on the streets of Bainbridge, February 27 last. The grand jury at the May term of court also found no bill.
