Half Storm Did Heavy Damage.

Dublin, Ga., May 26.—Later reports from the half storm which swept over this county a few days ago indicate that damage was done to the extent of many thousands of dollars. Some farms were ruined completely, no cotton or corn being left standing. In some sections chickens, pigs and turkeys were killed, shingles were knocked from the roof of houses and window panes were broken.

The storm was accompanied by high wind. In one or two places in the county fences were blown down, trees felled and roofs damaged. Outhouses were blown almost entirely away. The down-pour of rain was tremendous.

The main storm was about a half mile in width and crossed the county, going from northwest to southeast. The hail and wind reached further out than this, but the damage was slight in comparison with the damage done in the track of the storm, where the hail stones were as large as hen eggs, and fell so thick and fast as to completely cover the ground.

Samples of cotton and corn stalks have been brought here from the storm center, which contain not a leaf or a blade. It is said that entire fields of cotton and corn will have to be replanted.

Mr. Wilkes Beasom will replant his entire ten horse farm. Wm. Kea was damaged to the extent of \$500 or \$600; L. B. Linder suffered fully as much; Louis Parker suffered great loss, and other farmers report much damage done.

The farmers in track of the storm are naturally very despondent. Their oat fields were nearly ready for the orlade, and are now nothing but wrecks. In some fields not a head of oats was left.

Great Battle Cost

Russians 22 Ships

Washington, May 30.—The Japanese legation tonight gave out the following cablegram from Tokio:

"Fifth report from Togo received afternoon May 30:

The main force of our combined fleet, upon accepting surrender of the remaining Russian main force, near Lincourt Rocks in the afternoon of May 28, as already reported, stopped pursuit and while engaged in the disposition of surrendered ships found in a southwestern direction the Admiral Oushakoff, a coast defense ship. Thereupon Iwate and Yakumo were immediately dispatched in pursuit and invited her to surrender, but she refused and was sunk at 6 p. m. Her crew of over 800 men were rescued.

"Cruiser Dmitri Donaski was also found in the northwestern direction at 5 p. m., and was immediately overtaken and fired vigorously by our fourth division and second destroyer flotilla.

"She was attacked that night by the second destroyer flotilla, and the next morning was found aground on the Southeastern shore of Ureung island, off Korean coast.

"Our destroyer Saranami captured the evening of May 27 in the south of Ureung Rojstvenski and another admiral, both severely wounded, together with eighty Russians, including staff officers from the flagship Kuls Luvoroff, which was sunk at 5:29 p. m. on May 27. They were all taken prisoners.

"Our cruiser Chitose, while cruising northward on the morning of May 28, found and sank another Russian destroyer.

"Our cruiser Nitsaka, and destroyer Murakumo attacked also at noon on May 26, a Russian destroyer, which finally went aground.

HOW LOSSES FOOTED UP.

"According to various reports hitherto received and statements of prisoners, the result of the battle from May 27 to May 29 is as follows:

"Prince Suvaroff, Alexander III, Borodino, Dmitri Donaski, Admiral Nakimoff, Monomach, Jem-tuhog, Admiral Oushakoff, one converted cruiser and two destroyers, sunk.

"Nicholai I, Orel, Admiral Apraxine, Admiral Seniavin and destroyer Biedovy captured.

"According to the prisoners the Orel sank about 8 p. m. and the Navarin also was sunk.

"Almas on May 27 was observed in a disabled and sinking condition, but her final fate is yet unknown.

"The full particulars regarding the injury to our ships are not yet in hand, but so far as I could ascertain, none were seriously injured, all still being engaged in operations. The whole casualties are not yet ascertained. Casualties of first division are little over 400. Prince Yorhite in excellent health, Admiral Miu slightly wounded May 27.

MORE ABOUT THE LOSSES.

"Sixth report received the afternoon, May 30:

"Loss of Orel, Navarin confirmed. Sisoel Velky also definitely reported to have sunk on the morning of May 28.

"Official statement of Russian losses so far ascertained:

"Following six battleships sunk: Kniaz Suvaroff, Imperator Alexander Third, Borodino, Oslabia, Sisoel-Velky and Navarin.

"Following five cruisers sunk: Admiral Nakimoff, Dmitri, Donaski, Vladimir Monomach, Svet-

State Fair Modifies Rules.

Heretofore all articles, whether furnished by individuals or not, going in to make up the county exhibit, were not allowed to compete for any other premium; in other words, no one article could compete for more than one premium. At a meeting of the executive board of the Fair Association a few days ago it was decided to allow articles going in to make up a county exhibit to compete for the individual or special prize as well. Now anyone in Bulloch who has anything that they wish to enter for a prize can send it in and let it go in the county exhibit, and the management of that can and will take pleasure in entering it for them and seeing that their interest is taken care of.

We would ask all those who have something fine, either a fine bushel of corn, a few fine stalks of cotton, fine stalks of sugar cane, fine bushel of peas, potatoes, or anything else, to prepare it and let us take it along.

Bulloch has been allotted a fine space at the fair, and it is our intention to take the blue ribbon this year. We took second prize last year, being defeated for first premium by Spalding county. Now Spalding has announced that he will not come this year, and this makes our chance for first prize much easier, while it was our intention to lay Spalding out if she had come again, yet it is easier, to beat any of the others than it is to beat Spalding.

A MUCH DELAYED EFFORT

The Atlanta Journal has our sympathies in its struggle to create an impression that any considerable number of the voters of Georgia want Hoke Smith to enter the race for governor.

The Atlanta paper seems to be making a house to house canvass of the state, judging by the list of names they enabled to get in print. Petitions seemed to have been circulated in a number of counties, among the names signed we notice a large number are qualifying their preference for Mr. Smith by inserting the word "if somebody else don't run." Now there are very few men who read those petitions who will believe that the fellow who signed his name that way was really anxious as to whether Hoke Smith entered the race or not. In other words it failed to convey the idea that the moment is a spontaneous one. In fact about the only name on the list who seems to be anxious for Smith to run probably is the fellow who tested the petition, and his burning desire was probably inspired from Atlanta.

Replies to Mr. Ehridge.

It is not my desire nor my intention to endeavor to draw Mr. Ehridge into a controversy by this article, but to call the attention of the public to the gross injustice of some of his statements in Tuesday's issue of the News.

One of Mr. Ehridge's first statements is that the study of English is utterly neglected in our country. To say this to say that our country board of education, chairman and all, is incompetent.

Our public school system a complete force and excludes Bulloch county from any participation in the educational fund of the state, as the school law plainly says that no school in which competent instruction is not given in all the branches laid down in the course of study shall draw from the state.

Again he says that the main reason why this subject is thus neglected is because of the "obvious ignorance of the teachers of our country." Now this is a broad statement and I would be glad to know where Mr. Ehridge gets his authority for making it. I suppose all the teachers of this county hold licenses to teach, and if, for one, have always thought that the possession of a teacher's license, especially of a high grade presupposes a working knowledge of English grammar at the least.

Possibly he draws his conclusion from the fact that some of the teachers at our last meeting had the temerity to oppose themselves to his doctrine on the classifying of participles.

Again Mr. Ehridge says hold to no text book nor to no rules in teaching grammar as all authorities differ. Now I am aware that this is a common belief, but I hold that modern grammarians are a unit on all essentials, and that is what we have to do with in teaching English.

In conclusion I will say that I heartily endorse Mr. Ehridge's method in teaching the sentence, and that this is written through no ill will to him, but knowing, as I am sure I do, the personal and esprit corps of the majority of Bulloch county teachers, I really couldn't let such statements as he has made go entirely unchallenged.
