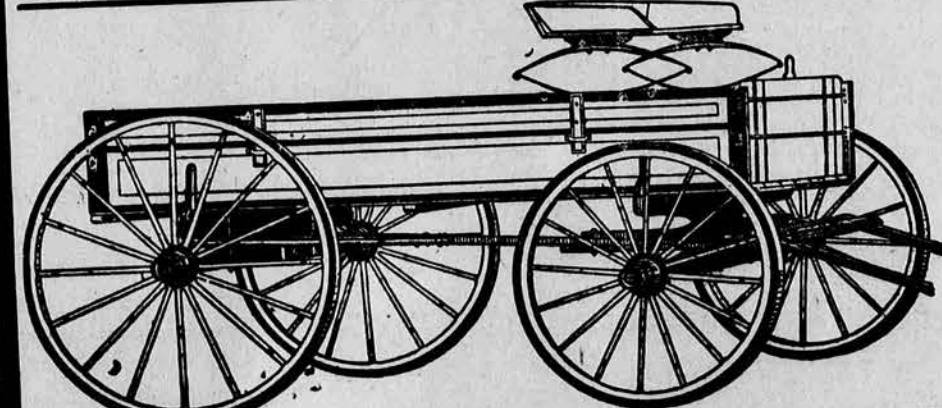

Was Leonard

Deceyed By Woman?

New York, Oct. 8.—Miss Katherine Leonard, sister of Harry A. Leonard, the young man who confessed to the theft of more than \$850,000 of securities from the National City bank, declared today that young Leonard was the victim of another man and that he was trying to protect the man and a woman.

Miss Leonard declared that she had given the woman's name to the police and that she believed the unreturned portion of the securities was placed in a safe deposit vault by the woman. Miss Leonard said:

"I don't know the name of the man who has used Harry as his tool, but I do know the woman." Miss Leonard denied the police story that part of the securities were found in the Leonard home.

Lawyer Abraham Levy has been retained to defend Leonard. After a long talk with the prisoner, Mr. Levy said that he was satisfied that there was no criminal intent on young Leonard's part, and that the whole affair was a foolish boyish escapade.

"When the young man is arraigned," said Mr. Levy, "I will make the contention that there was no criminal intent and think I will be able to convince the court of that fact."

Mr. Levy was the senior counsel for Nan Patterson.

Texas Troops Surrounded State.

Houston, Tex., Oct. 4.—The presence of troops at Edna has aroused the people to greater indignation and anger than ever. A large number of men who have been pursuing the negro, Monk Gibson, charged with complicity in the murder of the Condit family, have declared that they will cease their efforts so long as the troops are on the scene. Rumors have been sent into the thicket to call the other searchers from their work. Mr. Condit, husband and father of the murdered family, with a band of negroes, continues the search, however, and according to report, declares he will execute summary vengeance upon the negro if retaken regardless of the presence of the troops.

Several carloads of fresh horses reached Edna last night, with which to continue the search today, but the presence of rangers may cause the people to abandon the hunt altogether.

A report from Edna at 1 o'clock today says that Gibson has not yet been captured. Nothing is known of a report that the negro has been shot to death.

Failing in this he tonight telegraphed for the ordinary's return, which is eagerly anticipated by the assistant.

Will Take Weeks for Capt. Carter.

Chicago, Oct. 4.—Inquiry into the financial transactions of Capt. O. M. Carter, which netted him a fortune of \$600,000 in a few years and resulted in his serving five years in the military prison at Leavenworth, Kan., on a charge of defrauding the Federal government, was resumed today before Special Examiner Richard W. Wymann.

Assistant United States Attorney General Erwin questioned the defendant closely regarding a series of bond deals made in New York in 1895.

Carter explained that the money used in acquiring these securities belonged to R. F. Wescott, his father-in-law, he acting as financial agent while Wescott was traveling in Europe. The government produced bank books and accounts to the contrary.

This was Capt. Carter's ninth day on the witness stand, and it is expected that it will take several more weeks to complete the case.
