Russell Says He's a Winner.

Judge Richard B. Russell, candidate for governor of Georgia, was in the city yesterday as past grand representative of the K. of P. lodge, Windsor, Ga. He spoke freely on the present gubernatorial situation, and expressed absolute conviction that he would come through the race victorious. He will make no speeches today. On Friday he will appear at Kyrville, and on Saturday at Adria. He will spend to-day quietly at Gloucester with friends.

Judge Russell said, apropos of the present status of the race: "I am satisfied that I have gained more votes in the last six weeks than any candidate that has run for state office in many years. What about Hoke Smith refusing to meet me on the stump? Well, he has refused me twice, at Washington and at Toccoa. I wrote him a special and personal invitation to Washington, and on the occasion of the Toccoa meeting citizens of the town joined with me in the request, and as before I expressed my willingness to meet him then or at any other time he might designate.

"The date of the coming primary is perfectly satisfactory to me, I consider it favorable to my interests, but I have never asked a single favor of any member of the executive committee.

"As for Hoke Smith's belief that the date of the primary is intentionally unfavorable to him personally, I can only say that this complaint simply has the foundation that a complaint from any of us might have—that we are opposed by five men, all of whom will get votes. But he blubbers about it like a big fat baby boy.

Colonel Estill, I believe, is strong in South Georgia. As far as I have been through fourteen counties lately, and have visited sixty-seven counties in all.

"As to the issues of the campaign, I know of none more important than the lowering of the tax rate and the protection of the state's property. Other issues, such as the matter of disfranchisement, will be properly settled by the people themselves at the ballot.

As for the excitement about the white primary and the danger of the negro entering politics, I think there is absolutely nothing in it, because I believe the negro is entirely out of politics in this state.

"I do not know with absolute certainty whether or not Smith will be at Kyrville. I do not care to say anything about him now. I had rather meet him face to face.

"I find the present outlook very encouraging indeed, and in my canvass of the different counties I find that I have more real friends than I had in the race for chief justice.

"I think the chief weakness of Mr. Smith is his marked inconsistency in past life with everything he now professes.

"I have had no opportunity to indulge in political activity while on the present visit to Augusta, but I expect to return later and make a thorough canvass of Richmond county. I have many lifelong friends here, and many of them have called on me.

"I figure from present indications on carrying eighty-five counties. Few people believe it, but I will surely be nominated on the first ballot.

"By every rule of common sense I am the only man in the present race who represents the great body known as the common people of the state, and I am the only man who can absolutely guarantee a clean, honest and independent administration. I am not tied by any one coterie or clique of politicians or influence and I entered and am running this race without having asked the advice or consent of any man that now holds or ever held office in Georgia, and that is more than any one of the other candidates can say.

Poor Russia.

All the accounts we get of what is going on in connection with the assembly of the first parliamentary body known to the modern history of Russia go simply to emphasize the political ignorance of every body concerned. In any modern conception of the word "politics," the ignorance is more marked in the ruling and official classes of Russia than among the newly enfranchised Russians or their representatives. These latter would be little to blame if they showed initial inaptitude for setting in operation a new and untried organization of government. They would have a right to look for advice and assistance to those who have so long arrogated to themselves the exclusive capacity of governing Russia, if they believed the assurances of those men that they were anxious to work in harmony with what they call the "Parliament." The members of the new cabinet have certainly endeavored to create the impression that they were more liberal and more progressive than the administration of Count Witte, which they succeeded or supplanted.

And yet their first acts are of the old repression which they pretend to have abandoned. That representation of the Baltic provinces and of Poland is to be continued to Russians, and that the real people of those nationalities are to continue to be governed by Russia arbitrarily, this was perhaps to be expected, and at any rate it does not involve a breach of faith. But the eve of the assembly of the parliament should be chosen for the reaffirmation of the "fundamental laws" which in effect set forth that there is nothing to the purpose within the power of the national assembly to do and for the offer of a quite wanton destruction to the new-born national aspirations which is a political stupidity which seems to reach the point of what used to be called "judicial blindness."

Assuredly it does not show on the part of the government that desire to establish amicable relations with the assembly which the government has been professing.

Stranger than anything else to American ears is the announcement that what we should call the legislative "cabinet," attended by members of both houses of the newly elected legislature, has been broken up by an officer of police as a disorderly gathering. Nothing, of course, could have been more needless than the breaking up of the regular and formal meeting to lay down the lines upon they would endeavor to have the proceedings of their respective houses conducted. But this perfectly unobjectionable and salutary assembly was broken up at the point of the bayonet. It is possible, of course, that this action is the unauthorized performance of the individual who ordered it, to whom, according to his training and traditions, all public gatherings, except a church, were necessarily disorderly and seditious. But it looks as if his notion of a constitutional government and popular representation were quite as enlightened as that of the members of the Russian cabinet.—Macon Telegraph.
