It concerns the state of Georgia if it is true that a Georgia white woman and Confederate widow was turned from the doorsteps of a Georgian in a strange city by a negro, who did it by the order of a Georgia white man who was then wearing the honors made possible by a democratic victory, the only one since the Civil war.

Unfortunate, we repeat, that a Georgia white woman should be turned out of a job, and made to walk the streets of a strange city while negroes were given fat places that she could have filled.

The denial of Mr. Smith will satisfy his partisan supporters, of course. They are expected to say that it is sweeping and completely answers the case. They would say that no matter what Mr. Smith should answer, but how about the great mass of the unprejudiced voters who have refused to be blinded in this matter? At Albany Mr. Howell, in the presence of Mr. Smith and 4000 Georgia voters, offered to put up \$4000.00 that would say the charges were all true and each and every one of them could be supported by the records. Mr. Smith was asked to cover the matter with a similar amount. He refused to do so, and has failed to do so since. His partisan supporters are satisfied of course, but how about the great mass of the voters, are they satisfied with a denial that he refuses to back up that would bring about an investigation? We are inclined to believe they will demand a denial that is supported by something more than his own word.

### BROOKLET.

One of the most important steps, in a financial way, that the citizens of our community have taken is the establishing of a bank in Brooklet. There is not, possibly, another country locality in Georgia whose citizens could so easily subscribe and pay \$25,000, as was the case in Brooklet. In conversation with one of the directors last week he told us that he was quite sure that \$50,000 could easily be secured if they wished to increase the stock to that amount. In the personnel of the directors too much cannot be said, for they are, each and all, men of sterling worth—honorable, good citizens of the grand old commonwealth of Bulloch. At a meeting of the board of directors, held the week before last, Mr. J. N. Shearouse was elected president, and Prof. Paul B. Lewis as cashier.

We learn that it is the intention of the directors to build a handsome brick structure, of modern architecture, at once. Owing to the fact that the brick will have to be shipped here it will hardly be possible for the bank to open in its new building before October 1st, though we learn that the bank will be opened in temporary quarters September 1st. Surrounded as we are by one of the wealthiest and most prosperous communities in the state, it is safe to predict that it will meet with all the success it so richly deserves.

Next in importance is the magnificent ginery now being completed. New and modern machinery is being installed, and when the big whistle blows on August 1st, it will be a sight worth witnessing to see a bale of cotton ginned, packed and delivered in twenty minutes. Not a basket nor touch of the hand will be necessary until the cotton is in the press. A touch of a lever and the

steam press does the work. The seed is conveyed into a chute ready to load by springing a trap door, they are dumped into the wagon and the farmer, who heretofore had to lose the better part of a day to get his cotton ginned, can leave home early in the morning, get his cotton ginned and get back home for breakfast, if he wishes to. They don't propose to furnish meals at the ginners for others than the employees.

There are several residences being built and plans are almost daily being drawn for others, besides two churches and an addition to the academy, will be built during the fall and winter.

### Cotton Crop Sadly Short.

Atlanta, July 17.—From authentic reports to the Department of Agriculture, the cotton crop over the state will not be over 60 per cent. Information from the southern, southeastern and southwestern portions of the state, as well as the middle cotton belt, state that the plants are shedding badly.

The average for the southern portion will be less than 60 per cent., while the crop will only reach 75 per cent. in the middle portions. The shedding and rot is due to the continued rains.

Vegetation is also reported to be seriously impaired, while the peach crop will be depleted seriously if the rains continue. Cantaloupes have almost universally delayed in the storm swept section.

The corn crop, however, is reported to be in excellent condition, and will average 100 per cent.
