### BROOKLET.

One of the most important steps, in a financial way, that the citizens of our community have taken is the establishing of a bank in Brooklet. There is not, possibly, another country locality in Georgia whose citizens could so easily subscribe and pay \$25,000, as was the case in Brooklet. In conversation with one of the directors last week he told us that he was quite sure that \$50,000 could easily be secured if they wished to increase the stock to that amount. In the personnel of the directors too much cannot be said, for they are, each and all, men of sterling worth—honorable, good citizens of the grand old commonwealth of Bulloch. At a meeting of the board of directors, held the week before last, Mr. J. N. Shearouse was elected president, and Prof. Paul B. Lewis as cashier.

We learn that it is the intention of the directors to build a handsome brick structure, of modern architecture, at once. Owing to the fact that the brick will have to be shipped here it will hardly be possible for the bank to open in its new building before October 1st, though we learn that the bank will be opened in temporary quarters September 1st. Surrounded as we are by one of the wealthiest and most prosperous communities in the state, it is safe to predict that it will meet with all the success it so richly deserves.

Next in importance is the magnificent ginery now being completed. New and modern machinery is being installed, and when the big whistle blows on August 1st, it will be a sight worth witnessing to see a bale of cotton ginned, packed and delivered in twenty minutes. Not a basket nor touch of the hand will be necessary until the cotton is in the press. A touch of a lever and the

steam press does the work. The seed is conveyed into a chute ready to load by springing a trap door, they are dumped into the wagon and the farmer, who heretofore had to lose the better part of a day to get his cotton ginned, can leave home early in the morning, get his cotton ginned and get home for breakfast, if he wishes to. They don't propose to furnish meals at the ginners for others than the employees.

There are several residences being built and plans are almost daily being drawn for others, besides two churches and an addition to the academy, will be built during the fall and winter.

It is evident from that \$50,000 allowance to the Queen that Alfonso has none of those fallacious notions about being able to live as cheaply as one.

Professor William Lyons Phelps, of Yale, thinks it is possible that the whole history of Russia in the next twenty years will be changed because Gorky came here with a woman who is not his wife. This would seem to be taking the Russian novelist at his own exaggerated value. Had he been a Tolstoy or a Russian Victor Hugo the opinion would appear more credible.

We are a restless people. Every thin woman longs to be fat. Every fat woman wants to grow thin. Every town man longs for the time when he can retire to the quiet of the country, and every farmer hopes to some day quit work and move to town, where he can take life easy. Country newspaper men would like to try their hands on a city daily. The fellows on the big dailies dream of a time when they can own papers of their own. In youth we long for maturity, in age we yearn for the happy days of childhood, says the Sedgwick (Kan.) Pantagraph.

American food and game fishes have been sent to stock the waters of many foreign countries. Last year Mr. John W. Titcomb, of the United States Bureau of Fisheries, says Forest and Stream, made a successful trip to Argentina with fishes adapted to that country. Now the Galvark of Baroda, who is touring the United States to study its institutions, has been so impressed by the success of our fishermen enterprises, that he has expressed a desire to have an expert from the bureau go to India to give instructions in fish culture. This is of increased significance when it is considered that Great Britain might be expected to supply the talent in this field throughout her own possessions.

Aside from the steam railroads, the great public service corporations have been slow in making up to the possibilities of increasing their business through intelligent advertising. But an enlightened policy has lately taken hold of the active managers of gas, telephone, water and trolley companies all over the country, and all these utilities are more or less extensively advertised in the newspapers. Now it is reported that the electric light corporations, comparatively few of which have heretofore bought publicity, are about to launch an advertising campaign commensurate with the magnitude of their interests. Over \$135,000,000 worth of electricity was generated and sold last year, but it is reasoned that a co-operative movement to educate the public to new uses of the current will vastly increase consumption. The newspapers can do the work.

A New York City water supply project, for which \$100,000,000 will be spent, will involve the taking of some 18,000 acres of land in the Catskills, the obliteration of several villages, the obliteration of nineteen miles of railroad track, and the confiscation of boating and fishing privileges in many streams and ponds and lakes, states Forest and Stream. This is one of a rapidly growing number of instances of water supply extensions which involve the taking away of rights enjoyed from time immemorial by the angler. In Middle town, N. Y., a war has been waged for four years over the prohibition of fishing in the public reservoirs; the strife has split both political parties, made bitter enemies of lifelong friends and caused bloodshed several times. In Massachusetts the Legislature this year passed a bill permitting fishing and boating in several bodies of water in the Boston water system, but Governor Guild has vetoed the measure, holding that the lives of a million people should not be imperiled for the advantage of a few thousands.

## NOVEL PITCHER.

Novelty in inventions are always interesting, but of the many devices patented very few contain as unique an idea as the one shown here, a New York man being responsible for the scheme. The idea is shown here in connection with a pitcher or which has a compartment distinct from that for holding the fluid contents. The purpose of this compartment is to hold ice out of contact with the ordinary contents. The liquid in



Ice Cannot Dilute Contents.

The pitcher is shown by the shaded portion of the illustration, the pocket in which the ice is placed being slightly below the lower end of the handle. This pocket projects forward and downward and is otherwise so positioned that when the pitcher is filled in the usual manner for the purpose of pouring out the contents the ice, together with any water, is carried forward and thus prevented from leaving the pocket. Any water from the melting of ice in this way cannot dilute the contents, and the liquid maintains its proper degree of strength.

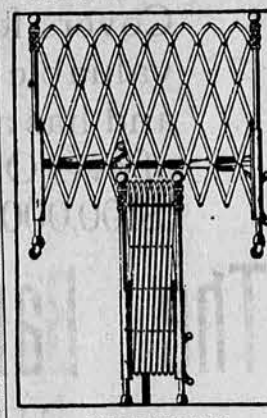

Near Augusta Walter McDonald, a 16-year-old son of a farmer, was blinded by shot at the hands of Joseph M. Sharpton, a grocer, who claims the boy was stealing water melons from his patch. The boy's face was literally riddled and he will probably never see again. Feeling against Sharp is intense.

**Reward Offered For Murderers.**  
A large reward is offered for the arrest and conviction of the person or persons who assassinated Lintner Williams, of Madison County, in February.

**More Atlanta Postal Clerks.**  
First Assistant Postmaster General Hitchcock has announced that ten additional postal clerks, at \$900 annually, had been authorized for Atlanta. The postoffice department has not made all the additional authorizations possible under the postal bill, and if requirements demand more clerks may be authorized later, provided the postmaster can convince the department they are indispensable.

**Carrollton Votes Bonds.**  
At an election held in Carrollton to determine whether or not bonds would be issued by the city for public improvement, bonds carried by 229 to 68. The amount of bonds voted was \$40,000. This money will be used for the purpose of constructing a new building, a \$15,000 city hall and paving the streets. The opposition to the bond issue will contest the matter in the proceedings to validate the bonds.

**Macon Preparing for Convention.**  
Officials of the Macon chamber of commerce have begun active arrangement for housing the big crowds at the coming state Democratic convention. Within three weeks every available place will be secured, and preparations will be made for an unusually large attendance. Citizens believe Macon will be amply able to take care of the delegates, and this belief is being backed up by actual hard work.

**Ploved Up His Cotton.**  
George W. Johnson, who lives two miles south of Dublin, astonished his neighbors a few days ago by putting his hands to work plowing up his cotton, which was in a very unimproved condition. He says that he found it would be a waste of time and money to attempt to make anything from his cotton crop. He decided that he could make more money by plowing up his cotton and planting peas where cotton was growing, and he promptly acted on his impression.

**Knocks Out Vote Buying.**  
By a vote of 111 to 3 the bill of Mr. Wright, of Richmond, to amend section 613 of the state constitution regarding vote buying and selling and illegal voting, was passed in the house. The bill makes it a misdemeanor for any person to contribute money for the purpose of buying votes either in a primary or regular election, and by the terms of the bill those who either spend money, or receive it for such purpose are made incompetent and punishable to testify in court concerning any prosecution brought for violations of the act, except that the evidence of such persons may not be used against them except in cases of prosecution for perjury.

**Charter of Road Amended.**  
By an amendment filed with the secretary of state, the charter of the Georgia, Florida and Alabama Railway Company provides for the building of a branch from the main line at Culbert in Randolph County through Randolph and Stewart and through Counties near Omaha in Stewart County on the Chattahoochee river.

# MOB IS ARRAIGNED

Nineteen Men Haled to Court  
in North Carolina.

**On Charge of Lynching.**  
Defendants Accused of Murder of J. V. Johnson, a White Man—Suff Charge is Delivered by the Presiding Judge.

A special term of Union county, North Carolina, superior court convened at Monroe, Monday, for the trial of the following alleged lynchings of John V. Johnson at Wadesboro on May 20th.

John McLaughlin, Tom Adams, Zeke Lewis, Joe J. Meacham, Clyde C. Bowman, John Jones, Elmer Dunn, Lester Johnson, John W. Novins, B. F. Thompson, Otis Martin, Fred Dunn, May Gillette, Lewis Adams, Jim Swink, Frank Graham, Will C. Dunn, Will A. Novins and Will Dow.

Judge Thomas J. Shaw presided. When the jury had been called to the box and his honor had put the usual questions as to taxes, etc., Judge Shaw said:

"It is a matter of common knowledge, gentlemen, that this is a special term of court, called for the trial of citizens of Anson county charged with lynching. If any of you have formed an opinion as to the guilt or innocence of the defendants hold up your hands."

Two jurors were excused and the judge continued:

"The reason I have asked these questions, gentlemen, is that from newspaper reports, I learn that parties have been in this county seeking to hold public opinion, either for or against the defendants, and I want to know if any of you gentlemen have been approached on the subject."

In charging the grand jury Judge Shaw said:

"There is no reason why we should deal with this question with gloves. I had just as well face it squarely. The charges against these men are that they conspired to kill a citizen of this county, and I don't know what else is on the docket."

He emphasized then the oath they had taken and elucidated the crime of perjury. The only escape for a guilty man is through perjury. So help him God, he declared to the jury, if justice should miscarry in this case, he (the judge) would not be responsible for it. He described the lynchings of Johnson as a mob of cowards and satirized their claim to good citizenship; he warned the jury against improper influences and said that the issue here was not that between law and lawlessness, but that between men who participated in that mob "are guilty of murder in the first degree."

With the conclusion of the charge the grand jury retired to consider the indictment against the alleged lynchings.

At the afternoon session four true bills were returned, and one no bill. The case being considered. Motion to quash the indictment was made and argued, and decision reserved.

Both sides are represented by able attorneys, and it is evident that the case will be fought hard. The trial is being held in Union county, having been removed from Anson, the county in which the lynching occurred.

# FOUL PLAY IS SUSPECTED.

Peach Train Wrecked and Three of Its Crew Met Death.

Foul play is believed by officials of the Central of Georgia railroad to have been responsible for the wreck of a freight train of that road near Marshallville, Ga., at 4:30 o'clock Monday afternoon, in which three men lost their lives. The dead are: Charles Greene, engineer; Sam Noid, colored fireman; Jim Redding, colored brakeman.

At the time the wreck occurred, there were only two cars attached to the engine, which was moving at a rapid rate. It was suddenly derailed and thrown with great violence to the side of the track.

Officials of the road state that it is thought that the derailment of the engine was caused by foul play. They give no reasons for this belief, saying they cannot discuss the matter at present.

Mr. Richardson saw him and opened his shirt, telling Mr. Brown to shoot. Brown accepted the invitation and immediately fired but his aim was poor, and Mr. Henry Bradley, who was a bystander, was struck in the thigh, the ball breaking the bone and passing through.

Drs. Floyd and Kennedy gave the wounded man immediate attention and pronounced the wound a very serious one.

After the shooting Richardson went out after his gun, but if he attempted to return he was intercepted.

Mr. Brown states that he regretted the shooting of Bradley, that it was Richardson whom he intended to shoot.

The occasion was an Estlin-Sheppard joint political rally, which was held at that place.

### Judge Norwood's Views.

Judge Norwood, of Savannah, has made one of the most valuable contributions to the present campaign in Georgia, his views being expressed in his usually clear and forcible style. On the question of disfranchisement, as proposed at this time, he says: A few words on Mr. Smith's platform. First, his disfranchisement plan. With many (and I am one of the many) this is a very popular cry. Giving the the ballot to all male negroes over 21 years, yesterday slaves—today freemen, illiterate, half-savage, was a brutal burlesque on every form of government known to the human race. It was conceived between the lecherous sheets of Thad Stevens saluted with his mulatto wench, it was born of hate, envy, jealousy malice revenge; it was swaddled with curses, maledictions and rage against the Southern Saxons; it was inaugurated to humiliate, to crush, to enslave, to rob the southern whites of the little that war and the torch had left, and to give the republican party perpetual masters of the south. That monster, Thad Stevens, in his midnight debaucheries, with his tan colored bedmate planned to confiscate our lands and give them to the negroes and their owners to be tenants under their negro masters and thus force the whites to emigrate, or to force the daughters and sons of their negro masters.

It is to be wondered at the word "disfranchisement" is a slogan to the south; that at its sound every eye flashes resentment and the blood rushes like a lava-torrent through the heart? Are we surprised to hear the politician shouting "disfranchisement" to arouse enthusiasm and enlist followers? What does it mean? It is something new—a bomb just found and offered to us by the discoverer, Hoke Smith. Let us be reasonable and take

care of ourselves and our mothers, wives and children. Let us look facts straight in the face and not like the caged eagle, assault the bars with wings, beak and claw to our own hurt. Can Mr. Smith disfranchise the negro? No more than a chained cat in a garret. He as governor can recommend action by the legislature—nothing more. Can the legislature disfranchise the negro? Should the legislators knowing its want of power call a convention—to amend our state constitution—could the convention disfranchise the negro? No, any more than the legislature can.

First: The constitution of the United States and treaties made thereunder are the supreme law of this land.

Second: The statutes passed by congress are second in authority.

Third: The constitution of each is third, and

Fourth: The statutes of each state are fourth.

This is the order of precedence in power and as given in our state code.

we can disfranchise the negro in but one way—by a repeal of the 15th amendment to the constitution of the United States. It reads:

"The right of the citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or any state, on account of race, color or previous condition of servitude."

To abolish negro suffrage that amendment must first be abolished. To abolish it, requires the united action of three-fourths of all the States. It is the dream of a madman to speak of any state having power to disfranchise the negro. It is lamentable that the southern states have not the power and is a reflection on the intelligence of our people to attempt to persuade them that they have that power.

But it is said it can be done, for North and South Carolina and Mississippi have done it. This statement is untrue. No state has done it because no state can do it. The grandfather clause is not disfranchisement of the negro. It is simply and only a regulation of the franchise or right to vote. It prescribes conditions that affect more negroes than white men—but it affects both races. Georgia, without attempting to disfranchise anyone, white or black, and without legislation, has accomplished completely what those three southern states have but partly accomplished. Georgia's method (the primary) is beyond the reach of congress and the federal courts. It is not an election. It is a selection for an election.

It is the nature of a regulation of society; of choosing one's company or associates. It says of the negro: "You shall not have a voice in selecting the candidate the white voters wish to put up; you can select your own candidates and vote for them on election day as we do."

The cry of disfranchisement is a delusion and a snare—"a spring to catch woodcocks." Besides a governor has no more power over the matter of the franchise than his cook has. To repeal the Fifteenth amendment: First, congress by two-thirds vote must recommend repeal to the states, and then three-fourths of the state legislatures must approve, or second; on failure of congress to recommend repeal, three-fourths of the states must take the initiative and vote either by their legislatures or through conventions, to repeal. Do you not see the absurdity of the declaration of a candidate for governor that he will disfranchise the negro?

Again, is the desire to disfranchise the negro a qualification important to the governorship? If so, there are two hundred thousands and white men in Georgia as well qualified as Hoke Smith to be governor; for they all desire disfranchisement as earnestly as he does.—Valdosta Times.
