## BLACK HAND LETTER SENT

To Asa G. Candler—18-Year-Old Member of His Sunday School Class Admits Guilt.

Atlanta, Ga.—Charged with attempting to blackmail Asa G. Candler, president of the Atlanta Chamber of Commerce, banker, and Atlanta's wealthiest citizen, out of \$35,000 by "blackhand" methods, Daniel W. Johnson, Jr., 18 years old, and a member of Mr. Candler's Sunday school class, was arrested Tuesday night at the instance of the postoffice inspectors and lodged in the Fulton county jail.

Johnson admits writing the letters and takes his arrest very coolly. He, however, declares he was the tool of three strangers, who he claims dictated his every action in the matter and forced him to write the demands for the money under penalty of death. He furnished the officers with a description of the three men.

On Friday of last week Mr. Candler received the first of the two letters written by the Bland Hand plotters, in which he was asked to place \$5,000 under the steps of the pastor's study of the Inman Park Methodist church on Monday night, April 5, "or you and your family will meet a horrible death at our hands." Sunday he received a second letter warning him to comply with the demands and further threatening him and his family if he failed to comply or if he made mention of the matter to a living soul.

Mr. Candler called George M. Sutton, chief postoffice inspector of the Atlanta division, in consultation and it was decided to trap the blackmail r. Mr. Candler drew \$35,000 in cash from the bank of which he is president, so as to guard against any possible betrayal of his plans. Monday night he made up a package and placed it at the point designated, the real money remaining in the meantime at his residence, guarded by detectives. Two detectives kept watch near where the fake package was placed, but no one appeared during the night for the package.

Tuesday morning Mr. Candler received a telephone message demanding that he place \$1,000 at a secluded spot on Moreland avenue between Anabel street and Walker alley. Again a fake package was prepared and placed at the spot designated Tuesday night and Johnson appeared from the darkness, grabbed up the package and started to run, but was in the grasp of detectives Lockhart and Coker before he was aware that he had been observed.

He was then taken to the Tower and after a grueling examination made a confession, admitting having written the two letters, but saying he acted under compulsion. The police give little credence to this story of having been forced to write the letters by three strangers.

The first letter, dated April 1, warned Mr. Candler that if he failed to put the sum at the spot indicated, "you alone shall meet death. Tell any one of it and you and your house—that is all that live with you—shall meet the most horrible death at our hands. Pony up with the sum and keep your face closed about it and all will be well. Fail to put the sum there and Hell will be to pay, nothing more or less than death."

The second letter advised Mr. Candler to "slide in close to the steps and put it under them and then '23' as hard you can. Do not fail or you will be blown to 'Kingdom Come' before April 6." Mr. Candler was little disturbed incident and it was stated Tuesday night that he would lose no sleep over fears of his home being dynamited.

## Death of Mrs. Stubbs.

Monday afternoon in Savannah Mrs. Susie Stubbs passed peacefully away after an illness covering several months with tuberculosis. The remains arrived on the morning train and was met at Clito by her father and other relatives the funeral and interment was made at Eureka church and cemetery Tuesday afternoon, Rev. C. J. Mallette conducting the services in the presence of a large assemblage of sorrowing friends and relatives. There were many floral tributes from friends of the deceased who had lived in Savannah for the past several years. Mrs. Stubbs was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. J. Malone of this county, she married Mr. Horace Mikell about fifteen years ago. Mr. Mikell lived only a few years and died with fever in Savannah, the remains were laid by the side of her first husband in Eureka cemetery.

Important Meeting.

The County Board of Education was in session Tuesday and transacted some business of general importance. They passed an order requiring students to attend school in their own school districts unless they get the consent of the board.

They also passed an order for the erection of two new school buildings; one just south of the city, not far from the Agricultural school, that will provide for the pupils on that side of town not eligible to the Agricultural school, and one just across Mill Creek near the Sand Hill ford.

Other than the above there was nothing done of general interest.

One fact developed is that Bulloch county teachers have not yet received one penny on last year's pay, while reports from other counties show that they have received large sums.

**Bad Saloon Keeper**

Will be Tin Canned.

Cincinnati, O.—This city is to witness the unusual coalition of the brewers and the anti-saloon league and the municipal reform league in a united effort to put the bad saloon keeper out of business.

Through the efforts of the Ohio Brewers' association the state legislature passed the Dean "charitable" law, under which the saloon keeper must swear to a number of interrogatories as to whether he has violated the Sunday closing law or allowed minors to enter his saloon, and so on.

If the saloon keeper answers "no" to all of the interrogatories, but it is found out that he has not given a correct answer to a single one, his license is to be revoked, and it is otherwise stringent.

The Dean law also says that only American citizens can run a saloon. A large number of foreigners run saloons in this city, but the Federal court will not let them naturalize until September.

While the Dean law went into effect April 1st. The point is as to when the law will be applied to the foreigner who runs a saloon, on the score of his naturalization, has not yet been settled.

The brewers declare they will aid the reformers in an effort to put the bad saloon keeper out of business. A brewing company at Hamilton announces that it will not sell beer to a saloon keeper who keeps his saloon open on Sunday. Another brewer in Hamilton recently made the rounds of his customers in that town and besought them to strictly observe the Sunday closing law.

Agents of the municipal reform league have already begun to collect information and the proof of infractions of the law will be filed before June 1, when the next annual tax payment is due.
