We have known small-caliber governors to do the same thing, and also others who felt themselves in authority over them.

The American people became an independent and powerful people because they revolted against the personal rule of a crowned head.

It is time we were getting back to simpler ways. The great common sense of the governor-elect—his dislike for showy pomp—his determination not to ape potentates—his democratic methods of thought and word deed—will do a very great deal toward starting a reform very much needed in our country. Six fine mules and two mch cows perished in the flames besides the loss of the building and the feed-stuff and farm machinery. The sight of the roasting of the live stock was awful to behold but the few residents of the little village were powerless to rescue them from the burning building.

It is believed that the fire was the work of incendiaries, Deputy Sheriff Donaldson went down with the bloodhounds but up to the last report from there nothing had been accomplished in the way of either the capture or the detection of the guilty parties.

This is the second barn that had been destroyed on the same spot within the past year or two and the loss falls pretty heavy on Mr. Robertson. The other time the barn was burned in the day time and there was no signs of incendiaries about it but this time the signs are pretty plain that the diabolical deed was the work of some midnight fiend.
