Congressman Edwards to Hold Farmers' Institutes. Washington, D. C., April 29.—Representative Edwards will hold Farmers' Institutes at various points in the First district some time toward the last of September.

The farmers will be invited to attend meetings at the court house, at which there will be lectures by experts from the agricultural department and addresses by Mr. Edwards himself on agricultural topics.

These institutes were begun several years ago by various congressmen, and proving a popular and a useful institution the idea has spread.

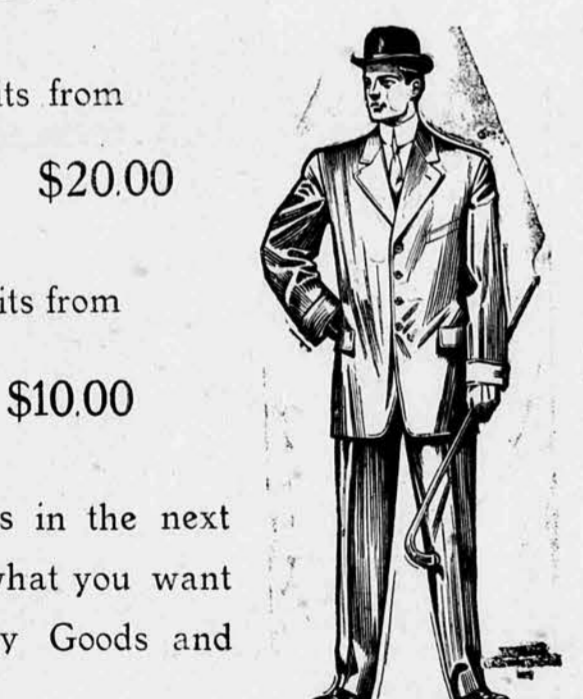
