S., A. & N. RAILROAD IN HANDS OF A RECEIVER.

Decree Ordered by Judge Speer to sell property on August 3.

Col. Hinton Booth returned from Macon yesterday morning where he went to argue the motion for appeal in the case of The W. J. Oliver Co. against The Savannah, Augusta & Northern Railway Co.

The case came up for a hearing and Judge Speer ruled against the plaintiff and ordered the property placed in the hands of a receiver and named Mr. Bowdrie Phinizy, of Augusta, as receiver. A decree ordering the sale of the road, fixing Aug. 3 as the day of sale, was also fixed.

Mr. J. N. Tally was appointed master to conduct the sale of the property.

The attorneys for the road have announced that they will carry the case to the United States court of appeals at New Orleans. This will be done when the road is advertised. A plea of illegality will be filed stopping the sale as in the case of sales under the state courts.
