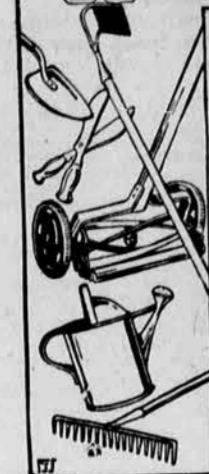

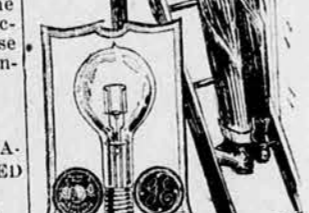

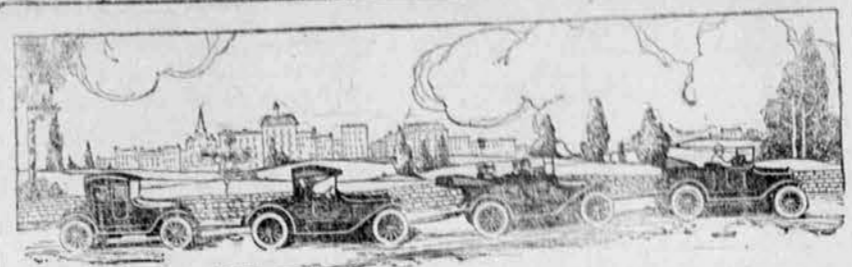

(Directions furnished by U. S. Department of Agriculture) The estimated cost of this most useful convenience is here given:

- Wood for the frame—\$ 10 1 Biscuit Pan, 12— 25 1 large Biscuit Pan— 15 1 square of Tin— 15 1 can White Enamel— 15 2 1/2 yards white cotton flannel— 25 Buttons— 10 Total— \$11.75

The shelves used in the inside of the refrigerator are made of tin roofing squares enameled white with perforations cut in them. In this cost screening is omitted. These refrigerators are more useful when screened against flies.

Have a case made 3 1/2 feet high with other dimensions 12 x15. Place two 1-inch wooden strips across the top over the screen, leave enough to allow a square pan to fit between the four corners. Have two movable shelves 12 to 15 inches apart in it. Use a pan 12-inches square (a 15c biscuit pan will answer) on the top to hold water and have the whole thing standing in a large pan. The pans and coverings are made of tin. Allow to all pans and coverings to be covered with white flannel should be made to fit it. Have the smooth side out and button the coverings on frame with buggy or automobile curtain hooks.

Paris, June 6.—In their repeated attacks on Fort Vaux, one of the outlying defenses of Verdun along the front east of the Meuse, the Germans are hurrying forward their infantry in masses so compact that the first ranks are obliged to advance to certain death.

The assaulting columns debouch from the village of Darnay, below the front and separated from it by a ravine which they are obliged to cross to attain the slopes near the fort. For three days this spot has been the scene of carnage which has saturated the ground with blood.

One German column advanced no farther than the bottom of the ravine. The front ranks pushed on by those behind, fell as fast as they reached the dead line swept by the French quick firers. As they toppled over others came on to take their place and fall in turn.

Schedules of the Southern and Central railroads were arranged at a conference in Atlanta between the railroad officials and representatives of the Georgia Fruit Exchange, General Manager E. J. Christmas of the fruit Exchange, says the schedules will be all that the growers desire.

The transportation companies estimate the peach crop this year between 200 and 300 cars in excess of the estimate of the fruit exchange, which fixed the number at approximately 3,300 cars. Reports as to the size, quality and condition of the fruit are said to be very flattering.

Because the platform committee was not ready to report, the Democratic convention at 12:31 a. m. recessed until 11 o'clock Friday.

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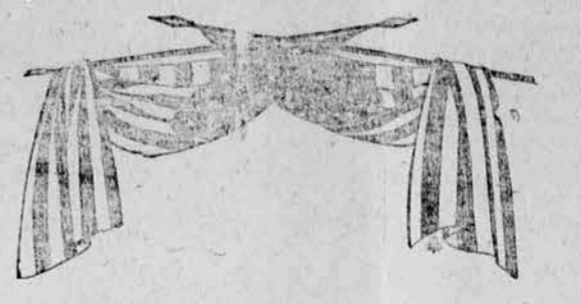

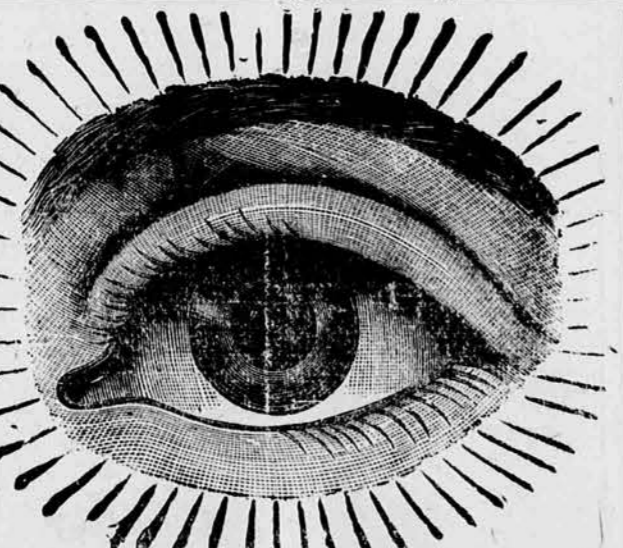
