**A GOOD CITIZEN'S DUTY.**

If you live in Statesboro and Bulloch county, and make your living here, you are NOT a good citizen unless you contribute your share toward helping to further the interests of every other man in the county.

If you claim citizenship and do nothing toward upbuilding your community, you are an intruder—an uninvited and unwelcome drone, and are not wanted.

If you are a drone and this community does not want you, it is a cinch no other community wants you either; so, resolve now to be a good citizen, and get behind the first good thing that comes your way and push with the rest of us.

Here is a chance for every man in Bulloch county to get behind the best move we could possibly undertake to further the interests of every person in the county.

We need a commercial organization of some kind that will successfully sell for the farmers, at a profit, all the farmers' products.

Let's get together and form ourselves into such an organization—call it what you may—select a live, wide-awake hustler for a secretary who will find a market for our farmers' products. Let there be a minimum commission charged for the selling which commission shall go toward maintaining the organization.

Let the organization's office be in Statesboro and let every farmer be able to get the best market quotations at any time.

When the produce is shipped, let the secretary draw on the purchaser for the money and after deducting the commissions determined upon beforehand turn the balance over to the farmer selling the produce.

By this means the farmers will know what they can raise and sell for cash; they can always keep informed as to market conditions and prices; they can find out when and where to ship and with only a few commissions sufficient to defray actual expenses of their own organization.

Let every man who reads this tell somebody else about it, talk about it and then be ready to respond to the call for membership when that call is made.

Forty thousand dollars was paid out to wage hands in the shipping quarters of Savannah last Saturday, which means that forty thousand dollars was put into circulation in that city within a few hours after the hands were paid off. That's a lot of money to be turned loose in retail circles, even in as large a city as Savannah, considering the dullness of the times. And judging from the activity in the same quarters, a larger amount will be paid out for labor this week. Go it, Savannah! We wish you well.

Creditors have been very lenient and smiled, for the most part, during this "hard times" fall and winter. Debtors have taken things as they came and held their cotton for better prices. But seem to have understood each other's position and things have been running as smoothly as could have been expected under the circumstances. The creditors made good to the debtors. It's up to the debtors now to make good to the creditors and do so as soon as they can sell their cotton at a reasonable price, and eight and three-quarters isn't bad.

**FIRE DESTROYS JOHN BARNES  
HOME EARLY YESTERDAY A. M.**

Fire broke out about 3 o'clock Thursday morning in the residence of John W. Barnes, on the corner of Courtland and Oak streets, and when the family awoke the greater part of the house was in flames.

Mrs. Barnes stated to a News representative that she and her husband attempted to drag the piano out onto the front porch and in doing so Mr. Barnes injured his back and side and had to be removed to the Rountree house and put to bed where medical attention was found to be necessary. The physician said he was not seriously hurt and was soon able to be up.

The house and its contents were completely destroyed with the exception of the piano and a few pictures, the family not even saving any of their clothing except that which they hastily put on when first aroused.

The house belonged to Judge J. W. Rountree and, it is understood, was covered by insurance. Mr. Barnes carried a \$500 policy on his furniture.

The origin of the fire is not known.
