Both parents, his two brothers, Willie Ernest and Edgar; three sisters, Willie Mae, Pearly Lou, and Eunice Elizabeth, all preceded him in death.

His early education began in Chatham County at Gadsen Elementary, Cuyler and Beach High Schools. He graduated Cum Laude at Savannah State College (Savannah State University) and there he was among the first twenty to organize the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity in 1949.
