

My Journey



Willie James Lavant, Sr entered earth on September 17. 1944 into the arms of the late Ferge & Edna Mae Lavant in Pembroke Georgia. After a brief illness, but hard fight, he departed earth Thursday night. March 17. 2022. He was the 10th child of eleven and the youngest male child born of his beloved parents. In May 1962, he graduated from Pembroke High School & began working at a local full-service gas station. Early in life, his parents taught him the importance of having good work ethics and being responsible. These attributes were carried forth and fine-tuned during his time of military service. At the beginning of his 22-years of service in the United States Army, he was married to his high school sweetheart, Lumisher Andrews for several years. From that union, they were blessed with his eldest daughter. Revardale.

While protecting our country during the Vietnam War along with tours of duty in Korea, Germany & other areas, he established his own business in music as a "DJ"-- A DISCOTHEK by Willie J. Inc. He made many friends and enjoyed years of displaying his unique light show while "spinning" music. Also, during his time in Germany, he was married to Waltraud Meyer for several years and was blessed with his second daughter, Jasmin. He returned to the United States to complete his military service and met Reader Mae Wright who blessed him with his son, JR. After his honorable discharge from the US Army, he received several certifications from area technical colleges. Additionally, he worked for several years with Pepsi Cola Company, the US Postal Service, and completed his work career by retiring from the Georgia Ports Authority.

For his next assignment, Willie J. followed in the footsteps of his older brothers by being ordained as Deacon at the church his parents helped to build and establish, Beautiful Zion Missionary Baptist Church (BZBC) in Pembroke GA. Because of his faithfulness in serving others, he became the Chairman of the Deacon Board. Affectionally referred to as "Deac" or "Deacon Willie J.", he devoted his life to taking care of not only the members of BZBC, but the upkeep of the facility as well. He was recognized and respected by many churches as the representative for Beautiful Zion. Because of his calling to be a blessing to others, he joined the Savannah Chatham County Layman's Ministry (CCLM), an evangelistic outreach ministry. Before COVID, he served as President and because of social limitations caused by the virus, he discovered his new assignment while serving with his daughter in distributing food. With an additional circle of friends, he began picking up and delivering food weekly from Food Distribution Centers to family, friends, church members, neighbors, etc. His home became a grocery store and he gladly shared items with anyone who entered. His leadership and commitment to serving others will be fondly remembered.

Willie J. will be greatly missed, but we thank GOD and give HIM the praise for time with our Beloved. Cherished memories will remain in the hearts of his daughters, Evangelist Dr. Revardale Lavant Middleton of Pooler, GA. Jasmin Lavant of Germany and his son, Willie J. Lavant, Jr. of Savannah. GA, 10 grandchildren in Germany, Sisters, Betty Givens of Dover, DE and Linda Bush of Bronx, NY along with a host of wonderful nieces, nephews, other relatives, and "special" friends. He is preceded in death by his parents and eight siblings.
