

BULLDOCK'S DEMOCRACY.

A mass meeting to select delegates to be held Monday, July 2nd.

The democracy of Bulloch county met at the court house in Statesboro on Monday, June 4th, in obedience to the call of Dr. D. L. Kennedy, chairman of the executive committee.

Dr. Kennedy took the chair, and after tendering his resignation, which was accepted, he called for nominations for a chairman to serve for the next two years.

Upon motion of Hon. F. M. Warren, Col. J. A. Brannen was elected chairman of the executive committee of the democratic party of the county. After a few appropriate remarks, thanking his friends for the honor, Col. Brannen took the chair.

The former secretary, was re-elected.

A motion was made by Col. D. R. Groover for those present from each militia district to meet at noon and elect an executive committee for the district, the chairman of said district committees to be ex officio members of the county executive committee.

Col. G. S. Johnston introduced a motion to hold a mass meeting in Statesboro on the first Monday in July to elect delegates to the gubernatorial, congressional and senatorial conventions. Carried.

The following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the democratic party of Bulloch county, in mass meeting assembled, renew its allegiance to the pledges of the Chicago platform.

The meeting then took recess for dinner.

AN ARTESIAN WELL.

Another effort is being made to secure an artesian well in the town. Mr. W. D. Davis has made a proposition to the citizens of the town to undertake the work, upon the condition that those who feel interested in the scheme will favor him with the loan of \$150 until January, free of interest; this sum being required to meet contingent expenses. Mr. Davis will set up the machinery by his mill, near the depot, which will enable him to use his engine for the purpose of boring the well, and then, if he is unable to force the water to all parts of the town. Those able to do so have freely subscribed to the small fund that has been asked for, and work will be begun on the well just as soon as some needed supplies can be secured; and Mr. Davis hopes to have his scheme in operation in time to supply water for the construction of the new court house.
