Facilities & Administrative Rates

What does F&A mean?

Facilities and Administrative costs. Recovered F&A costs reimburse the University for the actual costs associated with performing research that are not specifically allocable to any single sponsored project. Such costs include utilities, buildings and facilities costs, information technology infrastructure, department and central administrative costs associated with managing externally funded projects and libraries. F&A rates are based upon a calculation of actual costs and negotiated with the federal government.

What happens to the F&A recovered from my sponsored project?

Georgia Southern University has elected to distribute a portion of the recovered F&A funds back to the Investigators and Project Directors and their respective academic or administrative units.

If the money is returned to cover GSU costs, why do I get it back?

In order to provide an incentive for sponsored activity and to provide funds that are available to active investigators and project directors to collect pilot data or further their area of interest related to potential sponsored efforts.

How may I use my recovered F&A?

Recovered F&A funds may be used to acquire goods and services at the discretion of the recipient in the same ways you can spend departmental funds.
