This torpedo boat destroyer, of which so much is being said, is the new vessel which is a comparatively new type of vessel. They are built somewhat upon the lines of the torpedo boat, but are considerably larger, much heavier and faster. They carry small but powerful batteries of rapid fire guns, as well as torpedo tubes, and provided with rams strong enough to cut a torpedo boat or even a small cruiser in two. In size they come between the cruiser and the torpedo boat; in fighting qualities at close quarters they are held to rank superior to both. The destroyer is heavily armored, and the hold space is pretty nearly completely filled with machinery for making speed.—Ex.

An exchange says that "hundreds of millions of dollars have been appropriated within the last week or two for warships and war materials. The United States has appropriated \$50,000,000 for the construction of Great Britain \$120,000,000 for warships, and Russia \$70,000,000 for the same purpose. It is stated that Great Britain has already appropriated \$20,000,000 and Japan about as much more."

"The Brewton and Pinola railroad, as is known to most of our readers, is the old Atlantic Short Line, the roadbed having been made and the track laid for about twenty miles southeast of Brewton several years ago. In some way the Atlantic short line company became financially embarrassed and work on the road was abandoned. For over five years the twenty miles of road were not used. The embankments were nearly all washed away, the wood in the ties and the cross-ties in many places decayed, and the heavy steel rails became only streaks of rust.

"Last summer the property was sold in Savannah, the Central of Georgia company becoming the purchaser. Work on the line was resumed, and has been steadily going on ever since. The track has all been strengthened, the new ties put in and the damage done by rains repaired. It is announced that the last rail to Stillmore, in Emanuel county, will have been laid by the latter part of this week, and the road will then be ready for regular trains from Brewton to Stillmore.

"The Central does not mean to make Stillmore a terminus but will extend the road to Pinola, a station on the main stem of the Central twenty-five miles from Savannah. It is thought that trains, passenger and freight, will be put on between Dublin and Stillmore, running to Brewton for eight miles over the track of the Wrightsville and Tennesse road."
