Forage Testing Program

It has been several weeks since the forage testing program went into operation here in the state. If you haven't heard about it we would like to explain a few details of it.

This is a cooperative program of the Extension Service, University of Georgia College of Agriculture, and the State Department of Agriculture.

The purpose of this new program is to aid the farmer in the production of his livestock program. By following the recommendations of the tests you may reduce your feeding costs by producing good quality forage to the best advantage.

The forage test will tell you what supplemental feeding you should undertake, and also, what practices you should include in next year's forage production in order to bring it to a desirable stage.

My office has additional information on this new forage testing program.

Broiler Buies

Too many dollars are lost each year from unnecessary business in commercial broilers.

If you as a producer can do many things in order to minimize the tremendous loss. Today, let's review a few of the precautions you may take.

Swine Management Program

Good management is important in any kind of business. Swine business is certainly no exception, and here are some factors you should consider if you want your swine business to be up to par.

You should start with a meat-type boar or gilt. Just as in any other endeavor you must get a good start to be successful later on.

Make sure the boar you purchase is from a certified litter or sired by a CMS boar. The gift should come from a litter of uniform birth weight of an average of three pounds. The gilt should also come from a litter of ten or more pigs.

There are several points to consider in feeding your swine stock. The one we would mention today is for you to feed breeding stock separate from fattening lots.

Of course there are many more points to consider in operating a successful swine business.

The San Diego Evening Tribune pointed out that Khrushchev came to prominence as a farm expert and that's why an acknowledgment of agriculture in the Soviet Union must be particularly galling for him.

He began his drive by merging small collectives into larger ones, reducing the number of collective farms from 200,000 to 10,000 in 1950 and 1951.

State farms are owned and operated by the state with the help of hired labor working for wages. On collective farms peasants own the land on the basis of their labor contributions, after state claims have been satisfied, production expenses have been covered, and certain reserves have been built up.

But for all its ruthlessness, notes the Tribune, Soviet agriculture has not overcome the peasant's innate instinct for individualism.

The main question remains unanswered: Will the peasant produce as much and as efficiently for the state as he would for himself?
