Farm Bureau

West Side F.B. hears expert on control on weeds and grass

Chas. IPC will effectively control weeds and grass in cotton fields on top of the hill when the cotton seed are planted. Morris L. McDaniel, plant, West Side Farm Bureau Tuesday night.

Mr. McDaniel presented a plan on the methods of using chas. IPC and pointed out that several of the larger cotton growing areas had used it for two years.

Mr. Kelly urged the tobacco growers to procure their federal crop insurance prior to April 1. Growers that have been carrying the insurance automatically be included in 1954 unless they advise Mr. Kelly by February 28 that they wish to carry it in 1954.

Mr. Kelly also asked that those who wanted the insurance to check with him on the coverage and on their farms for this year, since it could be higher or lower than in 1953 because of the variation in average yields.

Mr. Kelly also pledged his cooperation in filing applications to build additional storage bins on the farms for those who wanted it.

W. H. Smith Jr., the West Side president, announced that E. C. Moore, secretary of the Cotton Seed Crushers Association, would be the speaker in the program to be given by the Farm Bureau and Rev. W. L. Huggins on March 1.

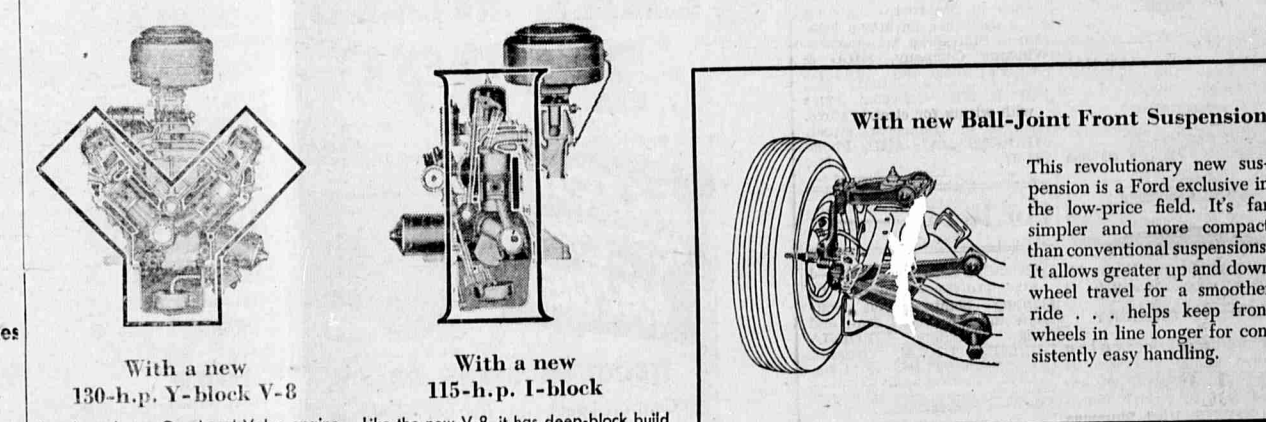

Arts Fair for
High Schools
March 26-27

Industrial arts work of junior high and high school students throughout the first congressional district will be on display and in competition during the Industrial Arts Fair at Georgia Teachers College on March 26-27.

Dr. Donald F. Hackett, head of the college division of fine arts practical arts, and general chairman, says a large representation is expected from the area schools in this fair which is scheduled on the campus at the same time as the annual Science Fair.

The competition is open to industrial arts students, boys and girls, from seventh through high school grades. Dr. Hackett pointed out boys will compete with boys and girls with girls, each in their own age groups. Seventh, eighth, and ninth graders compete in one group, and tenth, eleventh, and twelfth in the other.

Each competing student may enter one or more projects in one or more of seven special groups which include wood, metal, electricity, drafting, sketching, leather, plastics, and miscellaneous.

Each project must be accompanied by the student's project plan showing the working drawing, specifications, bill of material, and steps of procedure. Projects not accompanied by job plans will not be judged. Dr. Hackett warned any boy or girl in grades 7-12 who has been enrolled in industrial arts courses this school year is eligible to enter the competition. Projects must be delivered to the Industrial Arts building by 10 a. m. Friday, March 26, and may not be removed before noon the next day. An entry fee of 25 cents per project is required. The awards will be made at 4 p. m. Saturday.

This is the first year the fair has been restricted to the first congressional district. Last year the fair was held here. Dr. Hackett says he hopes to see a growing interest and increased participation in the fair this year. He pointed out that scheduling the Industrial Arts Fair and the Science Fair at the same time will enable some students to have exhibits at both fairs at the same time.
