'I Favor' ... 'I Do Not Favor' ...

ON APRIL 5 THE citizens of Bulloch County will go to the polls with the citizens of the other counties in Georgia to tell their elected representatives how they are thinking on the question of additional taxes to provide for the expanded services which was a plank in every politician's campaign platform in 1948.

When you go to the polls on April 5 you will not have the privilege of telling your representatives the kind of taxes you would like to see levied ... you only tell them you favor levying additional taxes to provide funds for expanded services.

According to the official text of the act calling for the referendum each ordinary will call the election and if a citizen favors additional taxes he will say:

"I favor financing the contingent appropriations made by the General Assembly for public health, education, aid to counties, rural highways, public welfare services, and other purposes, and I request that the General Assembly levy such additional taxes as are necessary to provide the funds."

If the citizen voter is opposed to increased taxes for these additional services he will say, as provided by the ballot:

"I oppose financing the contingent appropriations made by the General Assembly for public health, education, aid to counties, rural highways, public welfare services, and other purposes, and I request that the General Assembly not levy additional taxes to provide the funds."

If enough citizens say "I favor the contingent appropriations ..." it will amount to a green light for the General Assembly to pass any revenue measure it sees fit to raise the money to put into effect the contingent appropriation bill passed by the Legislature before it went home last month.

Industrial Survey

Here Is Your County

EDITOR'S NOTE—This is the third in the series of articles, "This Is Your County." The facts used in this series are taken from a survey made of Statesboro and Bulloch County by the Georgia Power Company. The second of the series presents the county's standing in the state in various crops. This week we give the net value of all farm products sold and used per acre.

Based on net value (total value less feed purchased) of all farm products sold and used per acre of combined crops and pasture land, Bulloch County ranks 82nd at \$25.25 per acre.

Based on net value of all farm products sold and used per farm worker, Bulloch County in efficiency, ranks 41st at \$1,396.56 produced per worker.

So that concept may be had of the competitive position of Bulloch County, last rank amounts to \$51.47 per acre in value produced and \$3,788.71 worth of product per worker. Incidentally this best efficiency determination is somewhat clouded in doubt, but not so the 2nd rank performance at \$2,640.14 per worker.

The trend in agricultural production in Georgia is toward increase in the livestock business as evidenced by census figures for "net income" as follows in percentages:

cigars and demi-tasse, and that food quantities can be estimated almost exactly, because no allowance need be made for second helpings.

Also Mrs. Nesbitt has a good point when she advises the hostess to ignore the anguished howls of her lord and master who doesn't want to struggle into a boiled shirt.

Yet I keep wondering how a truly busy hostess, like myself, who is ever on the alert for ways to save time could consistently ignore the protestations of a lord and master who don't only objects

From these determinations it may be concluded that, as of 1945, greatly more vegetables should have been raised and, if not inconsistent with the scientific cropping of Forest Products, more of these could well have been harvested and sold.

These figures also show that although Bulloch County, despite its first rank position in value of livestock and livestock products, sold other than dairy products, poultry and poultry products, it still lags far behind the state proportion for all livestock and livestock products, and has by only a small increment followed the commendable state trend as first shown above, that is, by a percentage from 23 to 39 per cent.

These comments notwithstanding, Bulloch County has quite substantially improved her 1945 livestock position over that prevailing in 1940.
