A Larger Membership For Farm Bureau in '50

Bulloch county's Farm Bureau membership will be larger this year than in 1948 if the reports from Denmark, Brooklet, and Middle Ground chapters can be taken as a guide.

Denmark reported most of the 79 they had last year already renewed along with several new members at their meeting Tuesday night. Brooklet had 180 Wednesday night but stated they would have 400 in a month. Middle Ground had 80 now and would have 150 by November.

The Denmark group voted to have a free barbecue supper for their November 1 meeting to celebrate their membership success. Clevy C. DeLoach, W. L. Dickerson, T. E. Cook, W. P. Fordham, and Tom Waters were named as a committee to prepare the supper. Following the picnic supper will be a motion picture, "Cows Must Eat," as a part of their program.

The Brooklet group voted to meet with the Leifield school on November 2, which has become an annual event. Corn contest winners were announced as follows: J. H. Wyatt first with 79 bushels per acre, Datis Hendrix second with 76 bushels, and Lannie Lee and Robbie Belcher tied for third with 69 bushels, and Lovett Edwards fifth with 65 bushels. The lowest yield in the contest was 43 bushels per acre.

The Middle Ground group served an oyster supper and then followed Brooklet's program with a discussion on the corn loan program, and pasture building. The Middle Ground group is still of the opinion that cotton farmers should help themselves plenty by destroying the old cotton stalks as rapidly as possible. These stalks provide too much chance for more weeds going into hibernation.

Mrs. E. L. Swicord Warnes About Cancer

Frederick of last week Mrs. E. L. Swicord, commander of the Bulloch County Cancer Society, attended a meeting of the American Cancer Society at the Biltmore Hotel in Atlanta.

Mrs. Swicord states that citizens of Bulloch county must learn to recognize "clues" to the dreaded disease. They are: Any sore throat that does not heal; a lump or thickening in the breast or elsewhere; unusual bleeding or discharge; any change in a wart or mole; persistent indigestion or difficulty in swallowing; persistent hoarseness, cough, and any change in normal bowel habits.

She states that according to the findings of the Society, any one of them may mean cancer.

She adds, however, that "only a good doctor can tell," and warns "don't try to be an amateur detective yourself. A wrong guess may cost you your life."

She points out that there are only three recognized cures for cancer, "surgery, X-ray, and radium. No advertised 'sure-cure' or home remedy ever cured cancer. They only give a cancer time to spread," she says.

World Reformation Day Is October 30

October 30 is World-Wide Protestant Reformation Day.
