COE Graduates Nearly 500 Students at Spring Commencement



COE graduated nearly 500 students during Georgia Southern University's 84th spring commencement ceremonies held Friday, May 11 and Saturday, May 12, 2012. More than 2,200 undergraduates and 400 graduate students were awarded Georgia Southern degrees during the ceremonies. There were 165 undergraduate COE degrees conferred. The 323 COE graduate degrees awarded this spring represents 80 percent of all graduate degrees awarded by Georgia Southern.

Honors Students Present Capstone Projects

Two College of Education honors students presented their capstone projects at the fifth annual University Honors Research Symposium, April 29, at the Nessmith Lane Conference Center. The Honors Program is designed to "foster the development of a critical sense of inquiry, a spirit of creativity, a global perspective and an ethic of civic responsibility," according to university documents. As part of that process, honors students are encouraged to use experiential learning, service learning and research to bring their ideas to life.
