In addition, since this is a “**special issue**,” *The Coastal Review* is also accepting works not presented at SECCLL. However, all articles must be unpublished, original, and of high academic standards.

Theme: *Reshaping the landscape*

With continuous efforts to reexamine old models and introduce new approaches, this special issue aims to provide a venue to highlight and discuss the important role of women in Hispanic culture and literature. We will consider articles in Spanish and English about women authors, themes, and new methods related to feminism, cultural studies, literature, social rights, etc.

Article Length

Because this journal is published electronically, page limits are not as relevant as they are in the world of print publications. This said, authors should exercise some discretion with respect to length. (Appropriate length would be approximately between 15 to 20 pages.). Authors need to adhere to MLA style rules. Articles must be received by **November 1 2016**.

Your proposal will undergo a blind review process, and you will receive notification of the decision regarding your submission once the review process has ended.
